Have you been reading articles about the precarious financial situation that Moira Adlan and her husband Ali Adlan; co-owners of the Hyland Cinema are trying to manage?

The 414-seat single screen Hyland Cinema, located on Wharncliffe Road South is independently owned and operated by Moira and Ali Adlan. It has an excellent projection and sound system as well as a new screen. The cinema premieres the most up-to-date releases from the Toronto, Cannes, and Sundance Film Festivals as well as offering retro movies and many films that are NOT shown at the other 3 multi-screen theatres in London.

The Hyland Cinema provides a wonderful venue for viewing the best art and international films in the world but it also provides a more traditional and affordable night at the movies!

The SLR Friends of the Hyland have been viewing amazing films and getting together to discuss them after the movie for several years (with a Covid hiatus). As of September 2023, the Friends of Hyland SLR Group has 41 members. We are optimistic that the owners of the Hyland Cinema will survive by repaying the Covid government loans (due this month).

SLR VOLUNTEER RECOGNITION - FEBRUARY 2024

SLR's 2019 - 2023 Strategic Plan included a strategy to Create a volunteer Management Committee to recruit and encourage volunteers. The SLR Board approved actions to support recruitment, retention and recognition of our volunteers. A committee was formed to develop programs to address the strategies. Thanks to Paul Webb, Michael Johnson, Diana Lloyd and Shari McNeill for their involvement in this committee.

In this article we are focusing on recognition of SLR's volunteers.

The Committee (with Board encouragement) agreed to create a database of volunteers documenting their service to SLR over the past 5 years. We went back through minutes, brochures, reports to document the SLR members who have been on committees, the Board of Directors, the Executive Council, Course Leadership and other roles within R. We decided on a 5-year lookback because we had good records going back that far. We developed a points system (e.g. Course Leadership for one term – 1 point, Board Chair - 1 point per year, Committee member - .5 points per year, Registrar - 2 points per year, and so on. Brian Henderson created the database and the Volunteer Committee assigned numerical values to the roles.

We agreed that we would recognize volunteers who have earned 20 points or more as of September 2023 at the 2024 Founders' Day Luncheon. Volunteers who have earned 10 - 19 points or more as of September 2023 - are receiving thank you notes and SLR pens.

We will continue to maintain this database - next year we will recognize the volunteers who have served/earned 20 points, 15 points and 10 points. We will be working with milestones of 5 years and all SLR Volunteers will continue to accumulate points for their service and are included in the database.

We are most grateful for the hard work of SLR Volunteers - You are the heart of SLR.
