SLR Moments in History

This year SLR celebrates 30 years of lifelong learning/peer learning. Special events and activities are planned and are described in another article in this newsletter. Once per month, we hope to include a brief SLR history article.



In 1993, Geoff Wright, who moved to London from Montreal, missed the McGill Society for Learning in Retirement group so much that he initiated discussion about bringing the SLR to London. Western's Senior Alumni members were approached with the idea and many joined SLR the following year.

SLR's first home was Westminster College with the assistance of Ray Gladwell, Executive Director of Westminster College. The Part Time and Continuing Education Department of U of

Western Ontario was highly involved as well. Geoff Wright, Ray Gladwell, Bob Stinson and Bertie Watts are considered the founding fathers of SLR London.

In its first term (fall 1994), SLR offered 6 courses and had 63 members. The courses included Exploring Dreams, Prospect for Humanistic Technology, What is Religion?

The Music We Love, The Modernization of Nations and Racism & Genocide.

Membership fees were \$10 and the cost per course was \$40.

By January 1995, membership grew to 100 members and 10 courses were offered. Three continued from the previous term (it seems they could not cover What is Religion in 10 weeks!) and 7 new ones were offered – including mystery writing, comedy, writing your life story. The fee per course was increased to \$50. (current SLR fees are a bargain!).

NOTES FROM EXECUTIVE COUNCIL MEETING MINUTES JAN 11, 2024

Business Arising:

• Emergency Preparedness Presentation: The Social Committee has a speaker for the Founder's Day lunch on the topic of dealing with medical emergencies, so the Emergency Preparedness Presentation has been postponed, possibly for May during Emergency Preparedness Week.

Committee Reports:

• Office Manager's Report: Michelle thanked Peggy for managing the phone messages and emails during her absence in November. It was expressed that we do not have simple instructions for accessing the files on Google Drive, especially for those who do not have a Gmail account.

Action Item: Michelle will work with Ed to make sure instructions are available to everyone who needs to use the SLR Google Drive files.

- Registrar's Report: Registration and Participation reports showed that our courses for the winter session are 90% sold with 179 members registered. Lynn pointed out that three courses were cancelled due to low enrolment, but that was not unexpected in the winter. Brian noted that the Computer Clinic also filled up quickly Our total paid membership has also gone up to 292, an increase of 28 members since the fall.
- Volunteer Management Committee: Phyllis reported that the committee has been working on a database of volunteers which Brian set up and allows the committee to update it regularly and keep track of volunteer efforts to be able to recognize and thank members for their work. Thank you, cards were sent to all course leaders, at the end of the fall session. The SLR Newsletter also highlights 2 volunteers in each edition. In addition, during the Founder's Day lunch the committee plans to recognize volunteers who have worked especially hard during the last 5 years.
- Curriculum Committees: The curriculum committees both reported that planning for the Spring session has begun, and meetings are planned in the next few weeks to work on course offerings.
- Social Committee: Diana reported that in addition to the Founder's Day lunch in February, the committee is planning a Games Night at Grosvenor Lodge in March and the Annual Meeting to be held at Siloam Church in April. Planning for Spring events will begin next week.
- Marketing and Communications Committee: Marketing: Peggy reported that the Open House went well, with a number of new and returning members registering. She also explained the need for more volunteers to help

out at promotional events. A number of suggestions were made for recruiting volunteers for this purpose.

Communication: Susan reported that she sent out the invitation for the course leader's workshop to the entire membership for the first time, hoping to attract members who might be interested in leading courses. She also informed us about the CBC morning news feature called 3rd Places that may be something SLR could participate in. There was some discussion about the possibility of having a book sale to raise funds. Action Item: Susan, with the help of Phyllis and Diana, will call on SLR members who were librarians to help organize such an event.

- On-line Learning Committee: Ed reported that he was not able to find Zoom hosts for every course this winter, so he has set up the Zoom meetings for those courses in advance without a host. Susan P. requested that a training session be organized for course leaders to learn how to use the equipment in our classrooms.
- Facilities and Equipment: Jeff reported that he has been working on updating the office laptop and is looking into getting another computer.
