IMPORTANT INFORMATION FOR OUR MEMBERS

Recently, SLR members have received phishing emails and many have expressed concern. Hopefully the information below will answer any questions you may have

Phishing is an attempt by perpetrators masquerading as legitimate businesses or a concerned person to acquire your sensitive data, such as your bank account numbers or contact list. You are told a "story" to hopefully convince you to buy gift cards, send cash, etc. Do not respond to it. Instead, either delete it immediately or, instead of hitting "reply", forward it to the person mentioned in the email to ask if they sent it. (Note: Every email has at least 3 email addresses in it: the sender's, yours, and the reply-to address. With legitimate emails, the sender's and reply-to addresses are the same. In phishing emails, the reply-to address is a fictitious one the hacker uses. If you do reply, then you give the "phisher" access to your contact list.)


Hacking is a more dangerous kind of email containing a link (usually underlined and in blue) or file attachment. If you click on it or open it, you are being hacked. Hacking comes in many forms, all of which involve giving the perpetrators access and control over your files and computer, including confidential information such as banking

details, your contacts and any information you have stored in file on your computer. Hackers can install monitoring programs to access passwords or shut down your PC, demanding money to release it. Large companies have been hacked simply by sending an innocuous email to an employee who clicks on a link giving hackers access to the entire system.

As we cruise the internet, particularly social media, we are enticed to click on a link to see something special or funny. **BE CAREFUL.**

If you think your emails and contacts have been accessed, change your passwords. We hope this helps clarify the issue.


