February is Black History Month. Each February, people across Canada participate in Black History Month events and celebrations that honour the legacy and contributions of Black people in Canada and their communities. In February 2008, Senator Donald Oliver, the first Black man appointed to the Senate, introduced the <u>Motion to Recognize</u> <u>Contributions of Black Canadians and February as Black</u> History Month. It received unanimous approval and was

adopted on March 4, 2008. The adoption of this motion completed Canada's parliamentary position on Black History Month.



In most provinces of Canada, the third Monday in February is observed as a regional statutory holiday, typically known in general as Family Day (French: *Jour de la famille*)—though some provinces use their own names, as they celebrate the day for different reasons. The third Monday of February is observed as "Family Day" in the

provinces of Alberta, British Columbia (BC), New Brunswick, Ontario, and Saskatchewan; as Louis Riel Day in Manitoba; as Nova Scotia Heritage Day in Nova Scotia; and as Islander Day in Prince Edward Island. In Canada more generally, the third Monday in February has also been celebrated as Heritage Day, though this is not as an official holiday. This "Heritage Day" is observed by some in celebration of the country's collective history, architecture, and cultural heritage.



At the stroke of noon on February 15, 1965, Canada's red and white maple leaf flag was raised for the very first time. The flag belongs to all Canadians; it is an emblem we all share. Although simple in design, Canada's flag well reflects the common values we hold so dear:

freedom, peace, respect, justice and tolerance. Canada's flag is a symbol that unites Canadians and expresses throughout the world and always our pride in being Canadian.


My first, carbon dioxide emits My second, a place of loose change deposits My whole, perhaps near the order pickup line sits. What am I?
