The beginnings of International Women's Day can be traced back to the early twentieth century. It emerged from the activities of labour movements in North America and Europe and reflected a growing call for women's equal participation in society. International Women's Day first took place on

March 19, 1911, in Austria, Denmark, Germany, and Switzerland. That day, over a million women and men attended public events to show their support. Other countries began to observe and celebrate this day in the years that followed. The United Nations recognized 1975 as International Women's Year and began celebrating March 8 as International Women's Day. Today, International Women's Day is a day of unity, celebration, reflection, advocacy, and action and is celebrated in many countries worldwide.



History of Commonwealth Day in Canada

In 1973, the National Council in Canada of the Royal Commonwealth Society suggested in a letter to Prime Minister Pierre Elliot Trudeau that the idea of Commonwealth Day to be observed simultaneously throughout the Commonwealth be included on the agenda for the Heads of Government Meeting to be

held in Ottawa that year. The proposal was not included in the agenda of that meeting but did appear as a Canadian item on the agenda of the 1975 meeting. At that time, the heads of Government agreed that the Commonwealth Secretariat be asked to select a date for such an observance that would not have any untoward historical connotations. At the meeting of senior officials in Canberra in May 1976, the Canadian proposal that the **second Monday in March** be set as Commonwealth Day was adopted.

Until 1977, it was the practice in Canada to observe Commonwealth Day on an ad hoc basis in conjunction with <u>Victoria Day</u> (a statutory holiday), also by <u>proclamation</u> the day for the celebration of the Sovereign's birthday.



Today, March 15, 2023 on the International Day to Combat Islamophobia, we stand in solidarity with Muslim communities across Canada and around the world. We reaffirm our commitment to take action to denounce and tackle Islamophobia, hate-fuelled violence, and systemic discrimination whenever and wherever it occurs.

All Canadians are asked to recommit to denouncing Islamophobia and to choose inclusion over intolerance as we continue to build a Canada that is safer, more equal, and equitable for everyone.

The collaboration and chat between the generations was wonderful, while laughter and winning shouts of delight rang through the old halls of Grosvenor Lodge.





Read me forwards I am the highest point of everything. Read me backwards scarcely anything is deeper. What am I? **Pit-Tip**


You can see me in water, but I never get wet. What am I? Reflextion
